Ridgeway High was approved as an
International Baccalaureate school this year!

Generally considered one of the most rigorous high-
school curricula in the world, **IB** was designed after
World War II for the children of diplomats who
sought an internationally recognized diploma that
would command respect around the world.

To earn the internationally recognized, world-class
IB diploma, motivated juniors and seniors must com-
plete rigorous coursework in six areas. Successful
completion of the program involves completing an
Extended Essay, coursework in Theory of
Knowledge, and the successful completion of 150
hours of service to the community. Students will
undergo evaluation from IB instructors throughout
the world. Students who are judged successful are
then awarded a diploma from the IBO.

2010 U.S. Census Don't Be Left Out!

The census serves as a basis for allocation of state and
federal grants and funds, for determining representation in
the U.S. House of Representatives, and is used everyday
by government on where to build new roads, hospitals,
child-care and senior citizen centers, schools and more.
Businesses use census to locate supermarkets, new
housing and other facilities.

March - Census forms are mailed or delivered to
households.

April 1 "National Census Day" - Use this day as a point
of reference for sending back your completed forms in the
mail.

April-July 2010 - Census takers visit households that did
not return a form by mail.

December 2010 - By law, the Census Bureau delivers
population information to the President for apportionment.
